

**Write to your representatives to pass the

“To require the Attorney General to designate Human Trafficking Coordinators for Federal judicial districts, and for other purposes.”

Impact:

- Increase public outreach and training programs related to helping human trafficking victims
- Thorough investigations on perpetrators
- Increased prosecution of traffickers
- Ensure restitution for victims
- Achieve justice for victims

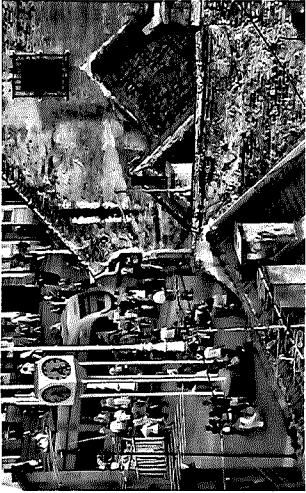

3. What can we as average citizens do?
 - a. Form special interest groups
 - i. Boycott or move away from companies who benefit from labor exploitation
 - ii. Only purchase goods from businesses who use fair labor
 - b. Write letter to state or local government representatives
 - i. Lay out the problems and explain what you and others would like done about the situation (i.e. form standards for where companies import goods from)
 - ii. Form a petition
 - c. Spread the word about companies who are doing business correctly and using fair labor
 - i. Form groups who have similar interests and want the same changes made
 4. Be knowledgeable about certain bills/legislative actions with regards to trafficking
 - a. Find ways to have a voice when it comes to trafficking standards
 - i. Many countries are following only the minimum levels and just need an extra push to grow
 - b. Find out if there are large trafficking hubs near your residence
 - i. If there is, attempt to start movements to build sanctuaries/shelters for trafficking victims

How to help fight Human Trafficking

First step is knowing and evaluate the situation!

- Give the victim immediate help if coming across them
- Go to local police, they hold trafficking prevention seminars around the country with high school and primary school students
- Inform the victim of their rights and choices they have to pursue their attackers
- Encourage them to tell their story so it might not happen to other people
- Contact the designated social worker in that county about the incident.
