## Answer each of these questions (1-3).

- 1. When talking of regulating freedom of speech the term "conduct vs. content" is used to distinguish when expression can or cannot be regulated. Explain plain the concept and provide and example.
- 2. There are times you can legally use copyrighted material without getting permission from the person who holds the copyright. Explain when this can be done how much you can use and how this is determined.
- 3. People often confuse the terms pornography, obscenity and indecency when referring to the legal aspects of the media. Explain the differences between the three.

- 4. One of the things determined when advertising a product is the "media mix." Explain the "media mix" and the factors that are considered when determining it.
- 5. A story is written about you in the local newspaper that claims you were one of the people arrested in a local drug sting. You threaten the newspaper with a suit for libel. What do you have to prove to successfully sue? What defenses can the newspaper use?
- 6. It is difficult to apply First Amendment freedoms such as freedom of speech, current freedom of speech laws such internet. Explain what some of the difficulties are and why they exist. Give an example.
- 7. Explain what is meant by the "uses and gratifications" theory of media's role in society. Give examples of some of the more common uses and gratifications that people derive from the media.
