Specific Purpose: To teach the class how to make a flower arrangement

Title

<u>Introduction</u>

- I. Attention Grabber: Look around you! There are flowers everywhere! In your backyard, on campus, in your grandmother's garden, what if you could take all that natural beauty and turn it into a work of art on display in your home or dorm? (show poster board of flower arrangements)
- II. Thesis/ Specific Purpose: Today I will be talking about how to make a professional flower arrangement.
- III. Credibility Statement: I am qualified to talk about this because I have been a florist for 2 years.
- IV. Preview of main points: First, we will gather the materials we need. Seconds, we will go over how to physically make the arrangement. Third, we will add any final details.

<u>Transition</u>: Now turn on off the logical, left side of your brain for a little and bring out the creative, right part of it because you're going to need it.

Body

I. Main Point # 1: First gather your materials

- C. Oasis: this is a good way to make a flower arrangement if you are a beginner because it is really easy to work with
 - 1. Cut your oasis to the shape of the inside of the vase.
 - 2. Create a foundation with the greens, placing them inside the oasis symmetrically.
 - 3. As in the previous instructions, put your flowers in while cutting them at different lengths so that the taller ones are in the middle and the shorter ones are on the outside.

(<u>Transition</u>: Once you have finished placing your foliage and flowers, there may be extra details you want to add.

- III. Main Point #3: Third, add the finals details.
 - A. Your arrangement may look a little empty, you can add a little bit of filler flowers like babys breath or wax flower to fill it up
 - B. You can also add a bow for a nice final touch.
 - C. Adding a butterfly or any other decoration is also cute thing that some people like to do to give it a springy look.

(<u>Transition</u>: Once you have finished all your final touches all you have to do is find a wonderful place to put it!

Conclusion

- I. Restate Specific purpose/ Thesis: To teach the class how to make a flower arrangement.
- II. Restate Main Points:
 - 1. First, gather your materials.

- A. A glass vase of your choice.
 - 1. It can be a short vase or a tall vase.
- B. Floral Tape or Oasis (depends on the type of vase).
- C. Scissors
- D. A greenery of some kind
 - 1. Leather fern is the best choice for tall vases
 - 2. Pitt is good for shorter vases
- E. Pick your flowers.

(<u>Transition</u>: Once you have gathered all your materials and have the image in your head of what you want to make, now your ready to start making it!

- II. Main Point # 2: Second, we will make the arrangement.
 - A. There are two types of flower arrangments, those that require floral tape to hold the flowers and those that require Oasis to hold the flowers.
 - B. Floral Tape: if you want to be able to see the stems freely in your vase use floral tape
 - 1. Put the floral tape in a grid shape on the top of the vase
 - 2. Create a foundation with the greens in the grid through the mouth of the vase to hold them
 - 3. Make sure everything is even, symmetry is key.
 - 4. Start to put your flowers in through your grid as well, cutting different length so there are taller stems in the middle and shorter one on the sides.
