#### I. Introduction

- Identifies article, article's purpose, and rhetorical context of essay using a Lead-in Sentence.

## II. Objective Academic Summary



- Presents an objective summary of it, using transitional devices, signal phrases, key terms, and parenthetical citation(s).
- ➤ Gives writer's thesis statement (your opinion about the article)

### III. Key Point 1 (choose one point from the article to respond to)

- Use a clear topic sentence to show what your point will be about this particular section of the article.
- Discuss your opinion about the point you have chosen. Weave your responses and ideas with the author's using "bookends" to hold together your borrowed material.
- Begin transition to next paragraph; try to create a transitional sentence that links the paragraphs together.

# IV. Key Point 2 (choose one point from the article to respond to)

- Use a clear topic sentence to show what your point will be about this particular section of the article.
- Discuss your opinion about the point you have chosen. Weave your responses and ideas with the author's using "bookends" to hold together your borrowed material.
