Preliminary Writing Assignment: Read Section A "Academic Reading, Writing and Speaking" in A Writer's Reference and complete worksheet. Then prepare a 1-2 page typewritten Argumentative Essay from the Comprehensive Writing Exercise Handout for submission Wednesday, September 7, 2016.

1. The Literary Paper

Read Section R "Researching" in the textbook and complete the worksheet to be submitted on Wednesday, September 14, 2016. Also read the handout information, "Guidelines for Writing a Literary Critical Analysis". Then find and bring three (3) poems and one secondary source (reference) for each poem on Monday, September 19, 2016: you will use one of the poems as a primary source to prepare a literary paper. A secondary source is any information (critique and/or analysis) written about the chosen poem.

Reading Suggestion: You may use any literature books, poetry books or even the Internet to find the poems and the reference information. You are to then prepare a 1-2 page (excluding the cover and works cited/reference pages) typewritten paper for submission on Monday, September 26, 2016.

2. The MLA Research Paper

Read Section MLA in the textbook and complete the worksheet to be submitted Wednesday, October 5, 2016. Then you are to prepare a 3-5 page (excluding the cover and works cited/reference pages) typewritten paper for submission on Monday, October 24, 2016. You are required to use at least four (4) references, but not more than two (2) from the Internet.

Suggested Topics: At least three (3) creative topics related to your Major should be submitted for approval by Wednesday, October 12, 2016.

3. The APA Research Paper

Read Section APA-1a -APA-5b in the textbook and complete the worksheet to be submitted Wednesday, November 2, 2016. Then you are to prepare a 3-5 page (excluding the cover and reference pages) typewritten paper to be submitted on Monday, November 21, 2016. You are required to use at least four (4) references, but not more than two (2) from the Internet.

Suggested topics: At least three (3) creative topics, on any subject of your choice, should be submitted for approval by Wednesday, November 9, 2016.
